
BOTTLE OVEN TYPE 3



DECORATING ENAMEL MUFFLE KILN

This type was used for decorating enamel firing and built in such a way that the flames and harmful gases of combustion were kept away from the pottery in the setting. In this coal-fired kiln Damper the flames did not directly Position enter the firing chamber, as downdraught updraught ovens, but were led around the outside of the chamber by a series of flues. In this way no sagaars



were required but the delicate colours of the decorated pottery were still protected. The firemouths were kept separate from the kiln chamber, sometimes outside in the open air.

A muffle kiln was a lot smaller than the other types of bottle oven and temperatures reached were lower at around 850°C.
